Budget Report - thru May

## Membership (Emily):

- o This season, we welcomed 37 new families. (For comparison purposes, we welcomed 46 new families in 2024.) Current accounts overview:
  - 350 active memberships
  - 7 quarter century memberships
  - 93 special memberships
  - 28 inactive members
- Filling this year's 37 spots required 86 individual offers, of which:
  - 43% accepted
  - 19% deferred for next year
  - 7% elected to go to the bottom of the waitlist
  - 7% moved out of the area
  - 14% joined another pool
  - 3% declined without sharing a reason; removed from waitlist
  - 7% never replied to numerous attempts; returned to bottom of waitlist
- 3. As of 7/9/25, our waitlist has 216 prospective families (18 deferrals and 198 regular). We are considering sending a simple Google Form this fall to gauge people's

continued interest. This will allow us to have a better sense of how healthy our waitlist actually is.

## Pools & Grounds (John/Mike):

- Many capital investment projects completed leading into this season:
  - Main pool and baby pool resurfacing
  - Power washing of facility (post construction)
  - Parking lot re-painted (added ADA spots)
  - o Grill and exhaust fan upgrades
  - Basketball hoop repair
  - Safety equipment for lifeguards
  - New appliances for snack-bar and office
  - Two (of five) sand filters replaced for main pool
- General/Pool Maintenance Activities:
  - Repair of baby pool pump seal (leaking in pump room)
  - o Repair of chemical feeding equipment
  - o Repair of Riptide portable pool vacuum.
  - o Replaced hose reels in both bathrooms.
  - o Reversed stall doors in both bathrooms.
  - o Signs, parts, pipes, other miscellaneous items as needed.
- Focus for the coming year will be on comminuted general maintenance around the facility
  as items are identified. We very much welcome notification (via email on website) if you
  see something that is in need of repair as we may not be aware of it. We do prioritize
  the repairs based on need and time availability.

## • Swim Team (Bill):

- The Seals are having a great season and are currently 2-2 in CMSL Division II. The final dual meet of the season (and senior day) will be July 19<sup>th</sup> at Rollingwood against Springlake.
- The Seals held an Open Pit fundraiser on July 6<sup>th</sup> following the Maple Lawn meet. We sold out of pit beef and turkey sandwiches and netted \$992 for the team. Thanks to everyone that came out and supported the Seals.
- The Seals will be hosting Andover, Five Oaks, Watermont, and Waverly Woods on Wednesday July 16<sup>th</sup> for our 21228 Invitational meet. This is an all 25m event fun meet that gives our swimmers a chance to visit and compete with their friends and classmates in the Catonsville area.
- The Seals will wrap up the season the week of July 20<sup>th</sup> with the Straehle Individual Championships on July 23<sup>rd</sup> at Andover and the CMSL Division II Championships on Jul 26<sup>th</sup> at South Carroll.
- The Seals would like to thank the Rollingwood membership for their support of the team and for sharing the facility for practices and meets throughout the season.
